


Woody Pear Walk

Class 3 - 700m return, allow 20 minutes



The woody pear's fruit is solid, pear-shaped and around 9cm long, and will only open when exposed to fire or when the tree dies.

Sheoak Walk

Class 3 - 2.5km Loop, allow 40 minutes



You can marvel at the twisted shapes of the sheoak's form after exposure to fire. Notice the woody fruits that have opened. It's a smiley face looking back at you.

Walk Trails around Nannup

The 2.5km **Heritage Walk** is a journey through the history of the town, telling the story of the buildings. Booklet available to purchase \$3

The **River Walk Trail** along the Blackwood River behind the Nannup Caravan Park. Not always accessible due to flooding.

The **Kondil Wildflower Park** meanders through jarrah forest. You can walk to this from the end of Brockman Street, over the renovated railway bridge and off to the left.

The **Karri Gully Walk Trail** is situated about 19kms on the left of Brockman Hwy on the way to Bridgetown. The walk is 20-30 mins long. This is where the Bibbulman Track crosses the highway.

Sidings Trail from Cambray to Barrabup Pool. The Siding Trail is part of the Munda Biddi cycling Trail from Jarrahwood to Nannup.

The old **Timberline Trail** is a 22km walk and cycle trail following a disused railway line between Nannup and Cambray Siding.

Bibbulman Track

One of the worlds longest distance walk trails which weaves through the shire of Nannup. Pick it up from Brockman Highway or Graphite Rd spend the night at Donnelly River Mill town



Walk safely, tread lightly

Nannup Bush Walks

Kondil Wildflower Park

Kondil is the Noongar name for the sheoak that was milled here when the Barrabup Mill was operational in 1910. Allocasuarina stumps, a type of sheoak, can still be seen as evidence of this era.

The park has three easy, well-defined walk trails each with a firm, even surface that wind through natural bushland of jarrah, marri, sheoak and balga.

Enjoy an impressive wildflower display in spring with orchids popping up early in the season. Please remember all plants are protected and should not be removed.

Wildflower Wander

Class 3 - 3.3km return, allow 1 hour



The delicate fringe lily is widespread in the south-west and will catch your eye with its beautiful mauve fringed edge.
